# MINUTES OF THE 6th BOARD MEETING 

## Venue: Residence of President Elect

Date: 17th December 2019
Time 7.30 Pm

The meeting was called to order by Club President at 7.30 pm . He thanks to all participants to be present in time. Minutes of the last board meeting has been approved unanimously and afterwards meeting proceed as per the agenda as following:

1. In the last breakfast meeting our members visited the school in Mohamadpur area and found it worth helping. The school has a student body up to class 2 . It has two parallel projects of female sewing school and a health camp. The school run by two separate group of youths need 76,800 taka for their expansion. GSR proposed to bring the two groups in our club as RCC. Therefore, decision has been made to call the two groups and explain what RCC is and persuade them to join as RCC in a single platform so that the project can be taken in the next higher stage.
2. Discussion on the furniture project reflects that it is going well. The autistic school which received our fund and furniture is moving from Mirpur to Banarupa. They need 60 more chairs which may cost approximately 120000 taka. Decision is made to buy 30 immediately and 30 to be managed later from other sources.
3. Eye camp project: A meeting to be called in presence of Mr. Abdullah immediately.
4. A new bank account has been proposed to be opened to cater the service projects where members can donate freely, even their Zakat money. After opening this, the fund will be kept separated from the club fund and different signatories will be maintained for this purpose.
5. Project committee chair present to the board a project with RCC Rowmary, Kurigram for distribution of 200 Blanket. Cost of the project is around Tk. 51,000 and Tk. 5000 Mr . Hadi, Tk. 5000 Mr . Faruque, Tk. 7500 Mr. Shahid, Tk. 2500 Mr. Rahim, Tk. 5000 Mr. Nizam and the balance amount will given by the president. After threadbare discussions board approved the project.
6. Project committee chair informed the board that we have given 50 pcs Desk and 18 Pcs Benches to Pre-primary Shishu Bikash Kendra and Tabitha Kindergarten at Amnura - - a highly marginalized SANTAL community / village in Chapai Nawabganj district. RCD Kawran Bazar and RC Dhaka is our partner. The cash contribution is Tk. 68,000 which will be paid equally by the three and Scholastica Limited is a Non-Rotary Partner who are giving the furniture.
7. Ms. Popy and Mr. Faizul's membership from the club was decided invalid from immediate effect as per their application/ inactivity with club dues.
8. Mr. Debashish will be offered membership as per everybody's approval.

As there is no other Business to be transacted the Meeting was concluded with Vote of Thanks to the chair.
