LIFE SKETCH OF PAUL P HARRIS (1868-1947)

### **FOUNDER OF ROTARY**



Paul Percival Harris, the founder of Rotary and second of six children to George N. Harris and Cornelia Bryan Harris, was born in Racine, Wisconsin on 19 April 1868. He grew at Wallingford, Vermont in the care of his paternal grandparent since the age of three. A man with wide knowledge and varied experience, received Bachelor degree for Physical Culture from the University of Vermont and L.L.B degree form the University of Iowa. He also received honorary LL.D. degree from the University of Vermont. He was married to Jean Thomson Harris, a Scottish girl and a co-member of the Chicago Prairie Club.

Before settling in Chicago in 1896 to practice law, he worked briefly as a newspaper reporter, a business teacher, stock company actor, a cowboy and a salesman for marble and granite. He traveled extensively in the U.S.A. and Europe. One evening when he visited the home of a professional friend, he came across a number of tradesman in their businesses while strolling in the quite neighborhood after the dinner. During this visit, Paul conceived the idea of a club which will bring the professionals from different trades together in a friendly spirit.

On 23 February, 1905, together with Sylvester Schiele, a coal merchant, Gustavus Loehr, a mining engineer and Haram Shorey, a merchant tailor, formed the first club and named it 'Rotary' as the members met in rotation at their places of business. As membership grew the idea spread to other cities, neighborhood and across the national boundaries. Paul Percival Harris became the first President of the National Association of Rotary Clubs (in 1910) and also of the International Association of Rotary Clubs (later renamed as Rotary International) in the year 1912. Until his death on 27 January 1947, Paul was an active member of Rotary.

Today, the Rotary covers over 162 countries with 1.2 million members in over 31,000 Clubs. It has touched the lives of millions in every corner of the world and can rightly claim that the every sets in Rotary world.

### Introduction of Rtn Gordon R. McInally President Rotary International

Gordon R. McInally is the president (2023-24) of Rotary International. He was educated at the Royal High School in Edinburgh and at the University of Dundee, where he earned his graduate degree in dental surgery. He operated his own dental practice in Edinburgh until 2016. Gordon was chair of the East of Scotland branch of the British Paedodontic Society and has held various academic positions. He has also served as a presbytery elder, chair of the Queensferry parish congregational board, and commissioner to the general assembly of the Church of Scotland.

Gordon joined Rotary in 1984 at age 26. A member of the Rotary Club of South Queensferry, he has served as president and vice president of Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland (RIBI). He has also served RI as a director and on several committees, including as an adviser to the 2022 Houston Convention Committee and chair of the Operations Review Committee.

Gordon says he looks forward to working with members to build new Rotary clubs and groups. "My vision is that Rotary should exist everywhere in a style to suit everyone who has the desire to be part of us and to help us do good in the world," he says.

Gordon is a patron of the UK-based nonprofit Hope and Homes for Children and led a partnership between that organization and RIBI to support children in Rwanda who had been orphaned in the genocide there. He is a patron of Trade-Aid, an initiative of the Rotary Club of Grantham Kesteven, Lincolnshire, England, that provides sustainable humanitarian aid to individuals, families, and businesses in the developing world. He is also an ambassador for Bipolar UK, a national mental health organization.

In his free time, Gordon enjoys rugby, good food and wine, and stick dressing, the traditional Scottish craft of making walking sticks.

Gordon wishes to dedicate his presidency to making the world a better place for his granddaughters, Ivy and Florence, to live and thrive.

A Rotary member since 1984, McInally has been president and vice president of Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland. He has also served Rotary International as a director and as member or chair of several committees. He is currently an adviser to the 2022 Houston Convention Committee and chair of the Operations Review Committee.

Gordon describes The Rotary Foundation as "the fuel that provides the energy to do Rotary service." He and his spouse, Heather, also a Rotarian, are Paul Harris Fellows, Major Donors, and Benefactors of The Rotary Foundation. They are also members of the Bequest Society.

### RI presidential theme 20 23-24



Rotary International President R. Gordon R. McInally called for members to capture the world's attention and lead the way toward possibilities far beyond our current expectations. McInally, a member of the Rotary Club of South Queensferry, West Lothian, Scotland, revealed the 2023-24 presidential theme, Create Hope in the World, to the 500 District Governors, during the Rotary International Assembly in Orlando, Florida, USA, on January 9, 2023. He urged members to promote peace in troubled nations, help those affected by conflict, and maintain the momentum of initiatives begun by past leaders.....

"The goal is to restore hope — to help the world heal from destructive conflicts and, in turn, to help us achieve lasting change for ourselves," McInally said at Rotary's annual training event for incoming district governors.

McInally spoke about a woman he met in Ban Taling Chan, Thailand, where Rotary members helped build houses, a meeting hall, and childcare and health care facilities following the tsunami that devastated South Asia in late 2004. The woman had lost her husband, her daughter, and her son in the tsunami, as well as her livelihood. But she still had a gift to offer McInally: a beautiful seashell.

"She went on to tell me that Rotary... had restored her optimism. We gave her hope," McInally said.

"This is how Rotary brings lasting change to the world," he added, "one restored or newly created hope at a time."

### **Promoting peace**

A significant way to bring hope to the world is to put a greater emphasis on peace, McInally said. He cited the action Rotary members have taken in the past year to support the people of Ukraine after the invasion by Russia. Rotary has made humanitarian relief a priority, attracting more Ukrainian members in the process. But McInally noted that true relief won't come without peace — not just in Ukraine, but in Yemen, Afghanistan, Syria, and dozens of other places around the globe.



Peace is the soil where hope takes root," McInally said.

McInally also emphasized the power of continuity, calling for Rotary members to continue the work of some past leaders. He pledged to maintain the Empowering Girls initiative launched by 2020-21 President Shekhar Mehta and uphold the emphasis on diversity, equity, and inclusion throughout Rotary. He also noted recent events that underscore the importance of Rotary's continuing focus on polio. In the past year, polio cases have emerged in many areas around the world, making it more crucial than ever for Rotary members to lead the fight against the disease.

To do that, McInally said, Rotary must continue to raise at least US\$50 million each year to receive the full 2-to-1 funding match from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. Only about 1 in 12 members currently gives to the polio eradication campaign, with fewer than 1 in 5 clubs donating each year.

McInally asked the district governors-elect for support creating a new sense of urgency in their clubs to help realize Rotary's vision of a polio-free world. "This is the time for us to go beyond what's necessary year to year and make sure we provide every resource necessary to succeed as quickly as possible," he added.

### Focusing on mental health

In addition, McInally said, Rotary members should offer hope to those affected by mental health challenges — a crisis exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic. Many people have lost family members, many more have found their social networks uprooted, and young people especially have had their educational and developmental paths interrupted. As a result, more people around the world are facing mental health issues. And yet, seeking assistance is often perceived as a sign of weakness.

"Nothing could be further from the truth," McInally said. "Reaching out for help is courageous — and continuing on a path toward wellness is even more so."

He added that Rotary will work to improve mental health services in the next year and beyond. Rotary should be known as an organization that takes care of its members as well as the people it serves, McInally said. "Any mental health professional will tell you that by helping others, we essentially help ourselves."

McInally ended his speech by describing his ideal balance of continuity and innovation. "Rotary helps create the conditions for peace, opportunity, and a future worth living," he said. "By continuing what we do best, by remaining open and willing to change, and by keeping our focus on building peace in the world and within ourselves, Rotary helps create a more peaceful world — a more hopeful world."





## Introduction of Chief Guest Dr. AFM Ruhal Haque Honorable MP and Chairman Parliamentary Standing Committee, Ministry of Science and Technology

Prof. Dr. A F M Ruhal Haque, a renowned orthopedic surgeon, former minister for health and family planning, Chairman, Standing Committee on Ministry of Science & Technology, consecutive 3 times (from 2007 to date) elected MP, former student leader, a veteran politician, educationist, researcher and philanthropist born in 1944 at Satkhira, Khulna. He has grown up himself as a successful leader while he was studding in Dhaka Medical College. He was elected VP of Dhaka medical college for the tenure from 1966-69. He obtained MBBS from Dhaka Medical College, in 1968. FRCS from Royal College of Surgeons, Edinburgh, United Kingdom. FICS from International College of Surgeons, America, Honorary FCPS from Bangladesh College of Physician and Surgeon. He is an honorary colonel of Bangladesh Army.

Prof. Ruhal Hague started his professional career at Holy Family Hospital in 1970 and participated in liberation war and helped injured freedom fighter with proper treatment and medicine. He went to England in 1971 and stared his career as Registrar- Orthopedics Canterbury, Brighton, Oxford, 1971 to 1981, in 1981 he returned back to Bangladesh and served as Associate professor and Orthopedics surgeon at Sher-E-Bangla Medical College, Barisal, and Dhaka Medical College from 1981-1993. In 1996 he was appointed as the Director and Professor of National Institute of Traumatology and Orthopedics Rehabilitation (NITOR). 1996 to 1999 (Former RIHD). He served as Professor, Chairman and Head, Department of Orthopedics, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University (Former PG Hospital), Dhaka, Bangladesh. 1999 -2001 He was the president of International College of Surgeons, Bangladesh Chapter He established a state of the art Orthopedic Hospital in the name of Trauma center which is the pioneer in private sector.

Beside his brilliant professional career in home and abroad he has been pursuing a very colorful political career since his student life. He is the elected MP from Satkhire-3 for consecutive three terms since 2009. He became cabinet Minister for Health and Family planning in 2009 and within short time brought significant positive change in our health sector. His community healthcare concept was appreciated globally.

In his professional life he received huge numbers of international and national awards for his outstanding contribution in medical, social and political fields. He is a key personality and plays important role in Awami League and current Government with many important responsibilities.

A former Rotarian and worthy decedent of Late Khan Bahadur Ahasanullah he is a noted philanthropist and actively involved with a number of charity organizations including President, Nalta Central Ahsania Mission, Satkhira and Dhaka Ahsania Mission and many more.

Al Amin Redwanur Rahman PHF have been selected as President of the club for Rotary Year 2024-25. Furthermore, Rtn. Bhashkar Ranjan Saha and Rtn. Israt Naznin Rinky has been elected unanimously as Secretary and Treasurer of the club for RY2023-24 respectively.

### **Club Assembly:**

During the year, one club assembly were held on 20th December 2022 at Hotel Bengal Canary Park, Gulahan-1 from 6:00 PM to 6:45 PM.

### **Family Program:**

We had organized one family events on 15th December 2022 at Hotel Grace 21. Almost all the Members attended the Program. Furthermore, family members of the club participated in various service projects.



### Governor's official Club visit:

Rotary Club of Dhaka Luminous participated in Governor's Official Club Visit & joint installation program at Celebrity Convention Hall, Gulshan-1 on 14th August 2022. Program was arranged by Governor of Rotary District 3281 for 60 rotary clubs jointly. From Rotary club of Dhaka Luminous, President Rtn. M Abdullah, Secretary Rtn. Al Amin Redwanur Rahman PHF and President Elect Rtn. Mohammad Monjurul Karim participated in the program.

### **District Program:**

A good number of club members attended in different district programs such as rotary year launching, TRF seminar, DTTS, PETS, SETS & TETS, Grant Management seminar, District Conference & district award program.

### **Rotary Image Building:**

Rotary Club of Dhaka Luminous with colaboration of its Media Partner Daily Dhaka Times (online daily news portal & Daily Newspaper) published activities of the club to uphold the image of Rotary.

### **Establishment of Joint colaboration:**

Rotary Club of Dhaka Luminous established Corporate Agreement (MoU) with Prime Bank Foundation on 15th February 2023. According to the terms & conditions of the agreement Prime Bank Foundation will arrange eye care camp & Cataract surgery of eye care project funded by Rotary Club of Dhaka Luminous.

### **Service Projects:**

We have successfully completed number of Projects. Among them followings are notable:

### • Distributing Sleeping Kits to underprivileged children

Continuing from earlier years, RCDLu has participated in distribution of sleeping kits to the underprivileged children throughout the country in partnership with Rotary Club of Dhaka and Sleeping Children Around the World (SCAW) a Canadian NGO and in association with other Rotary Clubs, Rotaract, Interact and Non-Rotary Partner Organizations. The sleeping kits consists of Mat (ground sheet), Blanket, Pillow, Tshirts/Frocks/Kamiz/Trousers, Slippers, Tiffin box, Mosquito net, Bed sheet, Pillowcase, Shorts, Hoody set, School bag, Water bottle etc. This project ensures that children go to school, sleep safely and lead a hygienic life. The project was implemented during 15 Dec 2022 to 15 Jan 2023. During this year 6,000 kits has been distributed among the children aged between 6 to 12.

### • Winter Cloth (Blanket) Distribution

During January 2023, Bangladesh experienced record breaking cold specially in the northern part of the country. In order to fight the cold weather, RCDLu distributed winter cloths jointly with Rotary Club of Dhaka and other volunteer organizations and Foundations to the underprivileged individuals of that area. The project was implemented throughout January and February 2023.

### • Eye care Project:

RCDLu have organized a free Eye Camp on 12 March 2023 at Old Rehabilitation Centre established by Givensee Group of Industries Ltd. In this eye camp, total 170 patients registered and received eye screening. Out them, 88 patients were distributed spectacles and another 39 were identified for cataract & PCO surgery. This eye camp was organized in collaboration with Prime Bank Eye Hospital Foundation.

### Basic Education Support Program:

To support basic education, RCDLu awarded scholarship on 29th March 2023 to the underprivileged female students of "Alok Shikhalay" which is situated at West Agargaon, Dhaka. The scholarship includes full year stipend for the students.



### • Seminar on Peace & Conflict Resolution:

Club arranged a seminar on peace and conflict resolution to aware member and participants on this burning issue. The fundamental purpose of the project is to summarize the causes of conflict from historical events and subsequent consequences of conflict as well as ways to resolve the conflict. The seminar was held on 30th April 2023 together with 200th general meeting.

### • Pure drinking water Project (Distribution & installation of Arsenic free Deep Tube well):

Rotary Club of Dhaka Luminous distributed and installed three Tube Wells in Alfadanga, Faridpur, to facilitate availability of pure Arsenic free drinking water. The project was implemented on 5th May 2023 in partnership with Rotary Community Corps (RCC) of Alfadanga, Faridpur and Daily Dhaka Times.

### • Environment Conservation through Tree plantation:

Rotary Club of Dhaka Luminous have planted more than 2,000 trees in the Alfadanga, Faridpur, one of the remote areas in Bangladesh. The project was implemented on 5th May 2023 in partnership with Rotary Community Corps (RCC) of Alfadanga, Faridpur and Daily Dhaka Times. Furthermore, RCDLu has also participated in joint project with other rotary clubs in distributing 10,000 plants to the students of Shingair High School, Shingair, Manikganj.

### Club Achievements:

RCDLu has been awarded "2021-22 ROTARY CITATION" on 3rd October 2023 for helping rotary serve to change lives of the people all over the world. Club has also been awarded "CITATION" for 2022-23 consecutively as a recognition to contineous efforts to service to humanity.

Overall, RY 2022-23 was a successful year for the club. In this connection, I would like to thank President Rtn. Mohammad Abdullah and the member of the board for RY 2022-23 and other Members of RCDLu and well-wishers for active participations in fellowship, club meetings and service project and for their continued support.

### 1. PURPOSE OF THE STRATEGIC PLAN

### 2. PROCESS OF DEVELOPING THE STRATEGIC PLAN

In July 2021, the Rotary Club of Dhaka Luminous initiated its pilot five years strategic planning process to identify the essential elements for club success and strategies for achieving that success. The planning process was undertaken through a rigorous consultative process that involved the club officers, directors, committee chairs and members. Through the years, the plan was continually enhanced to adopt the annual undertaking and goals of Rotary International.

This Plan aims to help its members, within the overall objectives of Rotary, focus on the Club as a constituent of Rotary International; ensure consistency with the Rotary Manual of Procedures (including Rotary Club Bylaws); and interface the Rotary Club of Dhaka Luminous planning with the strategic planning of the District.

### STRATEGIC DIRECTION

The strategic plan for 2021-2025 is informed by the fact that Rotary Club of Dhaka Luminous has instituted a strategic thinking, planning and management culture. Key achievements, challenges and lessons learned from the past have been used to determine the strategic direction for the period 2021-2025. On the basis of the foregoing, the following is the agreed upon as the vision, mission strategic direction and objectives of the club.

### 1. VISION, MISSION

### Vision:

To be a club of choice providing strategic service to our local, district, national and international community. The club is visibly seen as relevant within the community as progressive, dynamic, action-oriented, and ultimately effective.

### Mission:

To provide a friendly environment for all Club members while we help others. Being part of the RC of Luminous is a great way to be active in our community and also to make a difference on a global scale.

### 2. CORE VALUES

- **Passion** We strive to make a positive difference in the world.
- Support We care for each other and work together with goodwill and trust.

- to establish a membership recruitment team to identify (with the help of Club members)
  Prospective new club members to contact by phone and invite to a Club meeting.

### Orientation/assimilation of New Members into the Club

- have a well-structured New Member Orientation Program (proceeding a Membership Induction Ceremony) to educate prospective members about Rotary or as time requires;
- have a well-planned, memorable and meaningful induction ceremony that shall leave an Impression that Rotarians are important and highly valuable people;



### **Membership Retention**

- survey members to understand what value members feel they receive from Rotary membership and to find out whether members are as involved as they want to be;
- creating more fellowship opportunities as well as fun activities that involve their families;
- publicize that any member can bring a program/project by working through the program/Project committee respectively;
- use of print and digital media to improve flow of information among all stakeholders; club web site email and SMS.

### 2. PUBLIC RELATION

Goal: Increase the visibility of Rotary Club of Dhaka Luminous

### Specific objectives

- 1. Establish a website and other promotional materials (PR/ Branding Committee);
- 2. Secure the Governor once a year to address the club and/or secure at least one very prominent speaker who will make news (Program/Club Service Committee);
- 3. Submit at least one story a year to RI and District 3281 for possible publication;
- 4. Appreciate reporters who write stories about Rotary;
- 5. Establish relation with media houses.

- have dates/occasions to invite media representatives may be for lunch paid by the club in order to build relationships.
- ensure issuance of press releases/media advisories when the speaker is particularly prominent.

### 3. CLUB FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

**Goal:** Ensure that activities associated with the effective operation of the club are identified, planned, and executed.

### Specific objectives

- 1. Every committee to draft its annual action plan to be reviewed every club assembly
- 2. Reduce the average age in our club to 45 yrs. by attracting younger members to join the club.

- 4. Implement at least two significant fund-raising events p.a.
- 5. Have at least two off site meeting
- 6. Have at least three family /social events every year.



- 7. Secure the Governor once a year to address the Club and/or secure at least one very Prominent speaker who will make news (Program Committee).
- 8. Organize an essay completion based on Rotary principles every year.
- 9. Organize a seminar for the young people dealing with life and financial issues
- 10. Ensure over 90% of club officer attend district training seminar

**Leadership** - encourage club members to be active in the club committees and to consider club leadership roles. Identify new members from the beginning as leaders.

**Leadership** - make the path to club leadership transparent–productive committee member, committee co-chair, chair, director, president.

**Training**-increase existing club leaders' participation in Rotary District's club training opportunities.

**Program**- maintain a weekly program strategy that provides a balance of topics / speakers / workshops to keep interest at the highest level possible

**Program**- devote part of at least one program per month to informing and educating members about our club, RI, and each other (for example introduce a 5 min session of what is new in my field,

**Program**- focus on the development of high profile speakers that will attract extra guests to visit the club.

**Fellowship**- plan social events and activities to encourage socialization. with spouses outside of regular meetings. Expand social events to include a wide array of members and family of Rotarians. All family members will be invited to stand and be recognized as a group.

**Communication**- improve communication to club membership regarding board, officer and committee decisions and activities.

**New generation**- support the launch of Interact and Rotaract Club.

**New generation**- rejuvenate Vocational programs at local high schools and tertiary institutions e.g. essay competitions.

### Club Finance - Fund-Raising.

Implement at least two significant fund-raising events per annum with between 10% and 15% of their surplus set aside to sustain the Board's broad program of service activities with the balance made available for disbursement to selected service causes in accordance with the wishes of the Board.

### 4. SERVICE

**Goal:** To identify projects within the key areas of focus that will provide valued assistance, deliver enduring positive outcomes, and utilize member's skills and talents.

### Specific objectives

- 1. Identify and support at least 2 local projects every year.
- 2. Identify and support at least 1 international project every year.

### **Action Step**

- review club's ongoing service projects;
- training project committee on planning and conducting successful service project
- conduct or obtain a need assessment of local and neighboring communities;
- achieve agreement by the Board of the criteria to be used by Committees to evaluate proposals,



projects/charities/individuals for potential funding (governance function);

- publicize that any member can bring a program/project by working through the program/Project committee respectively;
- work with other organizations and volunteers in identifying and supporting local charities and projects, in the short- or long-term, where they
  - o provide the best value for money;
  - o make a real difference in the lives of the beneficiaries
- recognize club members who participate in and provide leadership to the club's service projects;
- ensure all projects are consistent with the objectives of rotary and enhance its reputation in the community.

#### 5. ROTARY FOUNDATION

#### Specific objectives

#### **Action steps**

- communicate to club members the Foundation goals set by the district and Trustees of The Rotary Foundation

#### **RISK ANALYSIS**

To be future-proofed and survive as a vibrant Club, the Rotary Club of Dhaka Luminous needs to be assured that it is relevant to:

- o its community of interest with regards to fund-raising efforts;
- o the community it serves with regards to the local and District/Cluster projects and services it support; and
- o its existing and prospective members with regards to opportunities for fellowship and Service Above Self.

Failure to operate efficiently and effectively risks the Club to becoming less relevant to its community of interest and to the community it serves, as well as becoming less attractive to members seeking active and meaningful engagement. To be effective and efficient, Rotary Club of Dhaka Luminous must be run on sound business principles including:

- o good governance, including a disaggregation of personnel involved in funds sourced and funds spent;
- o a tight Board, with significant devolvement of day to day decision making, to help separate Governance from management;
- o involvement of all members in significant decisions;
- o succession planning in key areas of operation; and
- o transparency of decision making criteria.



#### **PRIORITIES AND REVIEW**

Each year, during the 5 year period of the Strategic Plan, the new Board will determine the priorities for that year through an annual club assembly, consistent with the strategic goals, objectives, and activities identified in this plan. This Strategic Plan is a living document and will be reviewed annually by the Board. The incoming President will be:

- Ø totally conversant with the contents of this plan;
- Ø identify areas where there is a need to fine tune or update; and
- Ø to bring these to the Board and ultimately to the Club Membership for adoption.

#### FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

The Treasurer shall maintain a minimum cash balance as determined by the Board in the Club's accounts to ensure that sufficient funds exist to cover any unforeseen contingencies and shall alert the Board if current operations are forecast to breach this balance.

Every Club fundraising project shall have the dual objective of ensuring that the Club is financially sustainable and supports Board-approved charitable causes to the greatest extent possible. All fund raising projects shall set aside between 10% and 15% of their surplus to sustain the Board's broad program of service activities with the balance made available for disbursement to selected charitable causes in accordance with the wishes of the Board.

The Board notes that a year-end cash balance as it determines is required to fund ongoing committee program and further notes that major fund-raising programs should be scheduled at regular intervals during the year.

### Eye Care – a crying need by Rtn Mohammad Abdullah President 2022-23

Doly Rani, 45, resident of Hajaribagh Colony, Dhaka, lost hope to see again. Her vision has been become cloudy in the past three years and it has been deteriorating further. She was afraid to go to hospital for treatment. She visited a nearby hospital twice, however, fear as well as lack of money prevented her from receiving treatment. Symptoms such as distorted vision became more prevalent since the end of 2018. Hearing about free eye camp facility in her area, she visited the camp and got empowered from doctor and community leaders to perform surgery at nearby Prime Bank Eye Hospital. She stopped sewing, her only means of bread and butter, due to poor vision. After getting surgery she re-invented herself, a story she shared with the then Rotary Club of Dhaka Luminous' president. She can now see everything and is able to start her sewing again.






Doli Rani's sight restoration is the encouragement of Dhaka Luminous. Disease prevention and treatment is one of the primary areas of focus for Rotary out of seven focus areas. Restoration of sight and prevention of blindness are both very important ingredients of disease prevention and treatment. Despite effort from Government, NGOs, and private sectors, prevention of blindness is still a far reach destination for Bangladesh.

Nationwide Blindness Survey-2020 reveled a blink picture of blindness in the country below:

Causes of Severe Visual Impairment



Considering chart above, the conclusion and recommendation of Nationwide Blindness Survey-2020 are:

- Cataract is the primary cause, which is responsible for 81% of the severe visual impairment.
- 19 in every 100 adults aged 30 years or older suffers from any degree of visual impairment.
- An estimated 1.43 million people are living with mild to severe visual impairment in Bangladesh.
- The burden of bilateral blindness in Bangladesh decreased, but still poses a significant socio- economic challenge.
- Four out of five of these blind cases are avoidable.
- Visual Impairment has increased significantly over the last two decades, while spectacle coverage is very low
- Bilateral cataract blindness has reduced although cataract surgery coverage is low for moderate visual impairment.
- The lack of community-based eye care services continues to be a barrier to optimal uptake of eye care services.
- Disadvantaged group suffer most

The recommendations are brought and comprehensive. If we address cataract only it removes 81% of avoidable blindness; in other words, four out of five visual impairments can be cured by simple intervention of cataract surgery. Community based eye care services is another focus area which can remove the barrier of accessibility to the services. Therefore, we focused these two areas to serve. Needless to mention, it is not possible for one actor to do all of the above since it's a national issue and need a coordinated effort under the leadership of Government agencies.

To address national issue of reduction of avoidable blindness, Rotary Club of Dhaka Luminous (RCD Luminous) decided to start a signature project with the technical help of Prime Bank Eye Hospital, Dhanmondi, Dhaka. The fundamental focus of the project is to help disadvantage group. In this regard, RCD Luminous targeted most poverty-stricken areas, those not covered previously. Luminous project provided comprehensive services that started from eye screening at the doorstep of the poor communities. Local community informed the people through miking and leaflets on the day of eye camp. Thereafter, patients were screened by qualified doctor and prescribed either spectacles or surgery or other services at camp. Those who agreed to do cataract surgery at hospital they were transported to the hospital and then surgery done with post operative medicine. Cost related to all above initiative was borne by RCD Luminous. Below two tables are the detail performances of Luminous eye care project:

The dream was brought to reality once Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was signed with the Prime Bank Eye Hospital to do quality surgery of poor patients. This may eventually lead to accomplishing the long-term vision of RCD Luminous to build a community eye hospital to serve the poor.









### Basic Education & Literacy-A Fundamental Human Right

It is commonly said that a nation can prosper only if his citizens are educated. Rotary International also emphasize this concept and made it as one of the seven focal points of Rotary.

Rotary Club of Dhaka Luminous took several projects in line of RI's guidelines. We have adopted a signature project – giving School Furniture to those poor schools who cannot afford basic furniture i.e., table/chair to the students. These schools are mostly the primary schools at the village side where education is a challenge.

This is our continuous efforts to support the underprivileged schools and till date appx 750 sets of table and chairs were distributed across the country. Scholastica – well reputed education institute is sponsoring us in this regard. Every year they phase out number of furniture which with little fixing & painting can be easily reused. Reusing the furniture also puts less demand on environment.

Till now the project value is more than Tk one crore. Few glimpses of the project are shared below-


